About the NHFB

The National Health Funding Body (NHFB) and the Administrator of the National Health Funding Pool (the Pool) were established through the *National Health Reform Agreement* (2011) to support the transparent and independent administration of Commonwealth, State and Territory funding for public hospital services. The Pool is the mechanism through which public hospital funding flows to the states and territories. The Administrator is an independent statutory office holder, appointed by agreement of all governments, under the *National Health Reform Act 2011*. The NHFB is an independent agency of 35 people supporting the Administrator to oversee public hospital funding, operating as a non-corporate Commonwealth entity within the Health, Disability and Ageing Portfolio.
